## **GOD IN ALL SEASONS**

God led me to a Lutheran Church in San Diego when I was 13 years old. I came to be a part of this church family by first participating in their musical theatre program that Summer. In the Fall, following the end of their production of "Cinderella," (in which I played the Fairy Godmother), I started leading worship for Youth Group. Come Winter, I started helping out in the nursery on Sunday mornings. Then, in the Spring when I was 16 years old, I was invited to be a part of the adult worship ensemble, and was old enough to join the Choir. My involvement in the church kept growing until eventually, I became their Communications Specialist in my late teens/early twenties, and of course continued to participate in leading worship.

Do you notice a theme here? Yup, seasons. At a new member's retreat, where I helped to lead worship, I will never forget the exercise that my pastor at the time used to illustrate our ever-changing, non-linear relationship with the Lord. He explained that our life, and consequently our walk with God, can sometimes feel like the changing seasons: Sometimes, like the song "Bleak Midwinter," it can be hard to see God at work. It's cold, finances can be tight, and we miss loved ones a little extra during the holidays gone to be with the Lord. Then, we move into the Spring where there are new beginnings and transformation...just as Christ Himself is raised from death to life. Then, we move into Summer, which represents not only joy, optimism, and positivity, but also Sabbath rest from all of the hustle and bustle of school and work. Then there's the Fall, with its corncucopia of colors, which we associate with times of plenty and gratitude for the harvest, but also, change. The common thread amongst all these seasons is that God, whether you are struggling to see Him, or feel His presence as though he were sitting right next to you, is ever-present through the change.

We had to choose which season most reflected where we felt our relationship with God was at the time. I gave the same answer then as I do now: Fall. Much like the falling leaves, I see God all around me, even though I am continuing through a season of change. My family just made a big move, changing doctors, finding activities for our son...

We will have something for those who prefer the outdoors, those who have the gift of hospitality, those who love animals, those who have a heart for our unhoused neighbors, those who are gifted in sewing, arts and crafts, and cleaning. We will be blessing college students once again with a box of treats, school supplies, and more. We will be blessing first responders with cookies lovingly decorated by little ones. Best of all, we will gather afterwards to share our stories. We will share how doing God's work with our hands blesses us. We will share how we met someone new from church. We will share a meal and fellowship. We might learn of a need in our community we didn't even know existed. We will serve locally and globally. And we will be changed. Our hearts will be fuller. When we are the hands and feet of our Lord, when we come together as the body of Christ, when we share the gifts we have been given we can't help but grow in love. When we let the Spirit in, when we follow God's call to serve, we show we are "... Christians by our love..."

Delaney Wright has listened to God's whisper, or maybe it was a shout? She is our GWOH coordinator this year. I was so thrilled to hear that she wanted to take this challenge on. We have had several coordinators over the years and each one brings new ideas, gifts, and talent to the position. Delaney will too. But, she needs our help. It is a big job! So, what will you sign up to do this year? What? You have never participated in GWOH? What are you waiting for? You have an idea for a project? Great! Want to be a team leader? Or would vou rather be a worker bee? Do you have a Thrivent Action Grant you can request to support a project? There is something for everyone. Maybe you have participated in the past but want to try something new this year. There will be many options. And though it is helpful to sign-up in advance, you can also just show up that day and be "plugged in" on the spot.

Hope has participated in all of the GWOH days with the exception of 2020 in the height of the pandemic. Many people have been blessed locally and globally; here are a few: Breaking the Chains received a garden makeover at their safe house (a place of transition for those saved from human trafficking), the Marjoree Mason Center enjoved luncheon with a little carnival for the children, the Learning

Tree has been freshened and cleaned, pregnant moms on other continents have received baby kits, countless fleece blankets and quilts have gone out to warm and comfort, and foster children and youth received handmade duffels and pillowcases, many people have been gifted with a special woven cross. There are too many projects to mention, but you get the idea.

Hope will celebrate GWOH day on Sunday, September 10. Signups will begin, Sunday July 30. We will also be asking for donations of items needed for a few of the projects. Please check the weekly email blast and bulletin for more information. GWOH day is a reminder that EVERY DAY is GWOH day. It is a time to reflect on how God may be calling us to serve Him by serving others. It is a time to remember the purpose of Hope Lutheran church and to live out our mission statement of Extending Hope in Jesus.

Starting Sunday, Sept. 3 @ 10:45 am | Hope Conference Room


Please join us on September 3 when the Sunday morning adult class starts a new series on *Signs and Wonders: The Miracles of Jesus* by Amy-Jill Levine.


## GRACE CAN LEAD US HOME - BOOK STUDY

Wednesday Nights | September 6, 13, 20 + 27 @ 6:00 pm | Hope Conference Room

This September, Candy Paulsen will lead a four session study based on the book Grace Can Lead Us Home-a Christian Call to End Homelessness by Kevin Nye. Kevin is a writer and advocate working toward ending homelessness by engaging best practices.

He has written on the intersections of homelessness and faith for Religion News Service, Sojourners, Red Letter Christians, and more. Kevin currently lives with his wife and son in Minneapolis, MN, where he works as Housing Director at an organization addressing youth homelessness.

In this hybrid (Zoom and in person) class we will explore the causes of homelessness, ways to prevent homelessness, stories of unhoused individuals, how we as Christians can make a difference, and more. Candy has been in touch with the author and he will be joining us on Zoom for one of the sessions.



Here is a review of Grace Can Lead Us Home by Camden Morgante on Goodreads. "With a Masters of Divinity and a job in homeless services, Kevin Nye is ideally suited to lead us on this journey of the Christian response to homelessness. Indeed, Grace Can Lead Us Home combines the heart and theological wisdom of a pastor with the empathy and trauma-informed perspective of a social worker. Throughout Nye's book, he cites research and statistics while interweaving public policy and his personal stories of working with unhoused people. Nye always brings it back to the words and example of Jesus."

Each to-go box holds some kind of sandwich or main dish item, fruit, cookies/brownies/cupcakes, and usually some kind of summer salad-coleslaw, pasta salad, etc.

Through funds from Lutheran Hunger Network (LHN) we also provide drinks and an assortment of chips. So far 10 families/individuals have signed up to help, some have made dinners on multiple occasions. We have also had others donate drinks, snacks, and homemade treats.

If you would like to sign-up to provide a meal or get more information, please call Candy Paulsen at 559.313.9567. Our young delivery driver ended up taking a job on the east coast, so Candy and Jim Paulsen make the deliveries most weeks. We have monies through LHN to reimburse you for the cost of your ingredients. You would just save your receipts and give them to Jennifer in the office. This hearty weekly meal is very much appreciated by those who not only struggle with shelter, but also with food insecurity. Making the meal can be a good one-time family ministry, perhaps opening a conversation about service, those in need, and more.

Many thanks to all of you who have provided a meal. We have daily opportunities to be God's hands and feet. We have daily reminders to be grateful for our many blessings.






## **JULY 2023 COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**


